



Meet the specialist: Veteran and Vintage Car Rims.

A unique service for enthusiasts

Veteran Car Rims was founded in New Zealand in 1989 by Brian Black, and over time it came to be known as the only maker of authentic beaded-edge and lock-ring (or straight-sided) wheel rims. As such, it is responsible for supplying rims to many of the leading wheel-makers and it's set to expand further with the brothers at the helm.

"I like making things," Chris says, when asked what led him to purchase Veteran Car Rims. "It seemed to be a good business and it would have been a shame for the historic car community to have lost it."

Since moving the works to the Isle of Man, Chris and Matt have taken on two workers and continued supplying five types of rim - beaded-edge, rolled-edge, knife-edge, split and lock-ring - to wheel-makers around the globe and the factory, though compact, is neat, logically arranged and efficiently run.

Old-fashioned craftsmanship meets cutting-edge technology

On entering the works, the first machine one encounters is a guillotine, which simply cuts the sheet metal first to the right width and then to the right length. Next is a set of rollers, which takes the strips of metal and rolls them into an approximate circle. Each rolled-up strip moves on to the automatic welder and becomes an unbroken ring. "We weld it with a tag on each end," Chris explains, "to make sure you don't get a bad weld at the start and finish." Ninety per cent of the weld is then milled off, and the final dressing is done by hand.

The next stages are for the rings to go into a roller to be rolled into their final form. Chris's staff make it look extremely easy, but they remind us that "Some rims are more complicated than others." Some rolled-edge rims, for example, go through seven stages of rolling. There are also machines which can shrink or expand them if necessary. "When they're finished," Chris adds, "they're checked for dimensional accuracy by an inspector, and only after that do they have the size etched on."

Meet the specialist: Veteran and Vintage Car Rims

The business of making wheel rims is not an easy one to get into given the highly specialized machinery required. Every machine in the factory is a unique item made in New Zealand to a bespoke order from Brian Black. Essentially, nothing has changed from the way things were done in New Zealand, and in many ways the process is the same as it was 100 years ago, but Chris has made a few changes to bring the 35-year-old technology up to date. "We've invested in a digital automatic welder," he says. "The most important part of the wheel is the weld, and what we've done improves repeatability and consistency." The other machines have also had a kind of digital memory installed, so they retain data for certain dimensions and tolerances and ensure identical rims can be produced ad infinitum.

We have mentioned the different types of rims which Veteran Car Rims manufactures. It goes without saying that they are also made in all different sizes, for motorcycles as well as cars, and for vintage and classic models from Bentleys to MGBs, not just the veterans.

That's enough to cover almost every need, but there's more in the pipeline. "Historically, we've only ever made rims and let wheel-makers add furniture, but in America the Model T people want complete rims, so we're going to put the locating clamps and brackets on so they'll have a more complete product," says Chris. There will, of course, be very early or unconventional cars which, for absolute originality, require wheel rims not readily available, and Chris adds, "Other styles of rim may be available soon if the demand is there."

Focused on quality

If you ever buy beaded-edge or lock-ring wheels, the rims will likely have come from Veteran Car Rims because it's the only company making them, but that's not necessarily true with rolled-edge or knife-edge. Some wheel-makers use cheaper rims made in Asia. On a technical level, they differ insofar as the Manx-made rims are cold-rolled, from European quality-controlled steel stock, whereas others are typically spun. One difference between the Wedgwoods' rims and other makers' is, says Chris, that "Other rims have a different profile, which isn't actually the correct profile for the period. Ours have the correct profile."

The quality of the foreign products might be first-rate, but who can tell? The factories do not advertise outside of the industry. Chris's view is, "If you care about quality, authenticity, environmental legislation, air miles of products and guaranteed conditions of the workforce, buy British." As can be seen here, Chris is more than happy to show what goes on behind the scenes and will answer any questions anyone might have about his products. If you really wanted, he would, by prior arrangement, be prepared to show you around the works.

With Veteran Car Rims, what you see here is what you get - accurate, authentic reproduction rims made to a high standard by skilled craftsmen on the Isle of Man. To see the workings of the factory is about as good a guarantee as you can get for a product, and if you'd like Chris and Matt's wheel rims on your restoration project, you'd best talk to your wheel supplier and specify them.





Meeting Notes of the AOMC Delegates Meeting 20th November 2023 There were 87 attendees representing 67 clubs and 1 visitor (Guest Speaker).

Chair: Keith Mortimer, President AOMC

Minutes of the August meeting were accepted on a motion moved Daryl Meek (Goldfields CC), seconded Damian O'Doherty (Vintage & Classic CC Ballarat) and carried.

Presidents Report: American Motoring Show held yesterday was a good day with approx. 450 cars in attendance. A lot of work from AOMC committee, particularly Iain & Maureen Ross, Howard Billing, Mark Fenton and Philip Johnstone. Reward for Keith was wandering around and seeing the young families in attendance.

VicRoads working party met via zoom last week, with Keith (AOMC), Neil Athorn (VicFed) and 3 VicRoads representatives. Issues raised were license plates, illegal CPS usage, renewal issues, conditions on permits and inconsistencies around M & H plates. Further meetings will be scheduled. **Coming AOMC Events:**

- * Florence Thomson Tour 26th to 28th April. Based around Traralgon and touring the Gippsland region.
- * **National Motoring Heritage Day** Sunday 19th May 2024. AOMC are looking to support various events around the state.

Treasurers Report. Mark Fenton, AOMC Treasurer, apologised that he did not have the quarterly report with him as he had concentrated on the annual report. He reported that several clubs are yet to renew subscription.

AMHF Survey. Has been completed with around 6,000 respondents. Data is being processed. Engine number records. Philip Johnstone reported that demand continues with various makes being submitted, including Toranas, Monaro, EH Holden, Ford Gt, Falcon, Land Rover and 5 Lancias.

Delegates reports / General business:

Peter Paproth (FX-FJ CC) – Noted that the state titles were held recently in Ballarat, and it was pleasing to see the next generation of young kids coming into the movement. Director of the event was a young woman in her 20s.

Rick Cove (DVHCC) – Rick noted that he attended the Ballarat Delegates meeting via zoom, and although he could hear everything he was not able to make a comment. Similar thing happened with the taxation seminar.

Ian Clark (DVHCC) - Reported that the 50th anniversary Berwick Swap will take pace on February 3rd 2023. Also, the club is revising the Australia Day Car Show with an event being held in Dandenong on Friday January 26th.

Guest Speaker: Scott Watson – Variety Around Victoria. Scott is the events manager for Variety running the "Variety Bash" and "Rally Around Victoria". Variety's main car event is the Bash, but not many people know what happens with the money raised. It helps kids with illness, disability and their families reach their potential. Since the NDIS started, they have aimed at covering those who are not covered by NDIS.

In 2022, \$13.3 million was granted impacting 152,312 kids.2023 saw a 48% increase in requests for support.

Rally Around Victoria is a 3yo event that started during covid, as drivers were unable to leave Victoria. It is a 3 day event open to all vehicles and is mainly tarmac based with some small dirt sections. This years event starts at Cruden farm and travels to Waratah bay, Raymond island, Bairnsdale, Walhalla, Marysville, Healesville and to Berwick for the finish.

It is limited to 60 vehicles because of the size of the towns they are visiting and staying at.

Keith Mortimer thanked Scott for his presentation and announced a short break for supper.

AOMC AGM Meeting held 20th November 2023.

Treasurers Report: Mark Fenton presented the annual financial report for 2022/23 financial year. Accounting systems and support have been improved, financial standing is good and accounts have been independently reviewed. Total equity as at June 30, 2023 is \$255,728 leaving the AOMC in a steady financial position.

The accounts show a \$7,846 loss for the year, mainly due to the timing of event transactions.

There have been questions about the healthy bank balance of the AOMC. Mark pointed out that some of these funds are held in trust for the RACV for grants to small clubs also, there are liabilities for upcoming events.

A healthy bank balance also enables the AOMC to invest in programs such as the recent AHMF survey, and we are also ready to underwrite a group insurance scheme for clubs.

Shows and events have been good fundraisers in the past, but this has been challenging of late. The great work of Philip Johnstone with the Engine Number Records service has again raised over \$9,000 for the year.

Fees have remained stable, even though they are not covering the day to day running of the organisation, and Mark proposes no change to the fees for the 2024/25 financial year.

The financial benefit to the community from the movement is being measured by AOMC, and clubs are encouraged to provide data re charitable activities that can be put together as general movement contributions.

Notices of Motion:

It was moved Mark Fenton (AOMC, Chrysler Restorers Club), seconded Bill Ballard (F.O.R.D) that the 2022/23 annual financial report be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved Mark Fenton, seconded Peter Welten (Triumph CC) that the fees for 2024/25 remain unchanged. Motion carried.

Presidents Report: This past year the committee started to look at its purpose. It has come up with the following: "To support and protect the interests of motoring enthusiasts and our member clubs." The committee has also formed five priority areas, each with a team leader and a sub committee. These are:

Member Services – Club advice, Engine Number Records, seminars.

Events & Community Engagement – Events, Shows, Community benefit.

Communication & Enablement – website, social media, newsletter, delegates meetings.

Policy & Research – policy statements.

External Engagement – VicRoads, Dept of Transport, Politicians, Vic Fed, ASRF, Motorsport Australia, RACV, and any other organisation we need to deal with.

Keith then introduced Geoff Hergt (Jaguar CC) to chair the election of office bearers and committee. All position were declared vacant and nominations called for.

Secretary – Tony Hall (Escape Motoring) was the only nomination and was duly elected.

Treasurer – Mark Fenton (Chrysler Restorers) was the only nomination and was duly elected.

Vice President – Iain Ross (Vintage Drivers Club) was the only nomination and was duly elected.

President – Keith Mortimer (Jaguar CC) was the only nomination and was duly elected.

It was moved Daryl Meek (Veteran CC) seconded Peter Welten (Triumph CC) that the number of Ordinary committee members be 8. Motion was carried.

There were 5 nominations for committee positions being: Lawrence Glynn (BMW Drivers), Philip Johnstone (TSOA), Peter Matthews (Classic Motorcycle Club), Robbie Mihelcic (Vic Torana Club), and Ken Goodin (Vict. Torana Club). There being no further nominations those 5 nominees were duly elected to committee for 2023/24 year.

Keith Mortimer announced the meeting closed at 9.06pm.

ANOTHER EASY RECIPE FOR YOU TO TRY.

Old Fashioned Rock Cakes.

Prep time 15 minutes Cook time 20 minutes


Makes 20

Ingredients

1 1/2 cups self -raising flour
1/2 cup plain flour
1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/3 cup cater sugar
100g butter, chilled, chopped
3/4 cup sultanas
2 tablespoon mixed peel
1 egg lightly beaten
1/3 cup milk

Butter to serve.

Method



- 2. Sift flours and cinnamon into a large bowl. Stir in sugar . Using your fingertips, rub butter through mixture until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in sultanas and mixed peel. Make a well in the centre. Combine egg and milk in a jug. Pour egg n milk into well. Using a butter knife, mix ingredients to form a sticky dough. Add more milk if necessary.
- 3. Spoon 1 1/2 tablespoons of mixture 5cm apart onto prepared trays.
- 4. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until golden. Transfer to a wire rack and cool . Serve Rock Cakes warm or at room temperature with butter.

This recipe is one that I grew up with. When you have 6 kids to feed, something like this is a bit of a godsend. My mother could knock them up almost without thinking and we all often enjoyed them.



This car was treasured by Peter O:Dea, one of our club members who passed away.

Peter was in the process of restoring the Dodge and only had the assemble of the bonnet area and front floor pan ,plus a clean up to complete the restoration.

Due to Peter having a hip problem, a Holden motor and Automatic transmission was installed.

The car comes with lots of spare parts, including spare mud guards, the original Dodge motor and gear box, another Dodge motor, plus spare wire wheels and tyres.

New wiring has been professionally installed with all electrical components upgraded or replaced and converted to 12 volt.


















