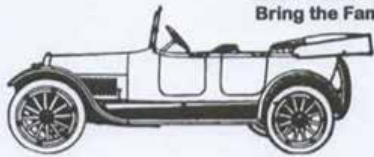

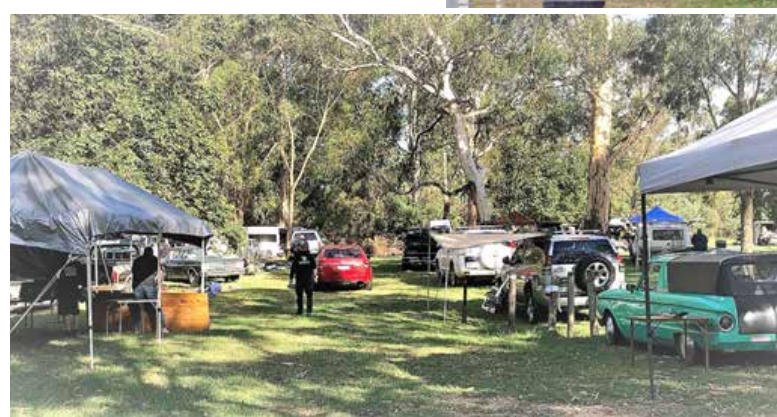

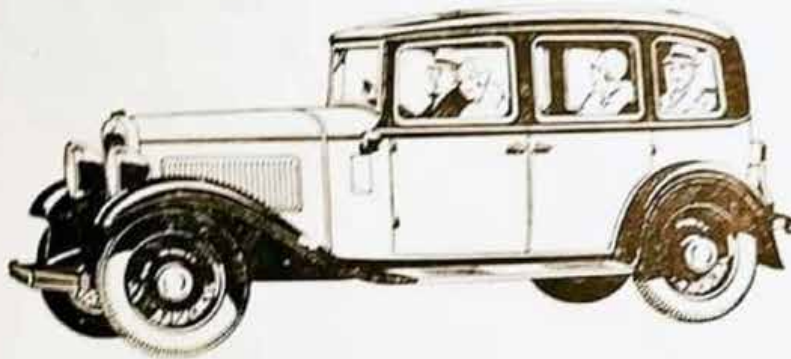

The Ner-A-Car was a type of feet forwards motorcycle designed by Carl Neracher in 1918. It used an unusual steel-channel chassis, much like an automobile, and hub-center steering at the front wheel, making it 'nearly a car' in design. The Ner-A-Car was the most successful hub-center steering motorcycle ever produced, . About 10,000 Neracars were manufactured in the United States by the Ner-A-Car Corporation (under the Neracar name), while around 6,500 are believed to have been produced in England under licence by the Sheffield-Simplex company between 1921 and 1926 under the Ner-A-Car name.

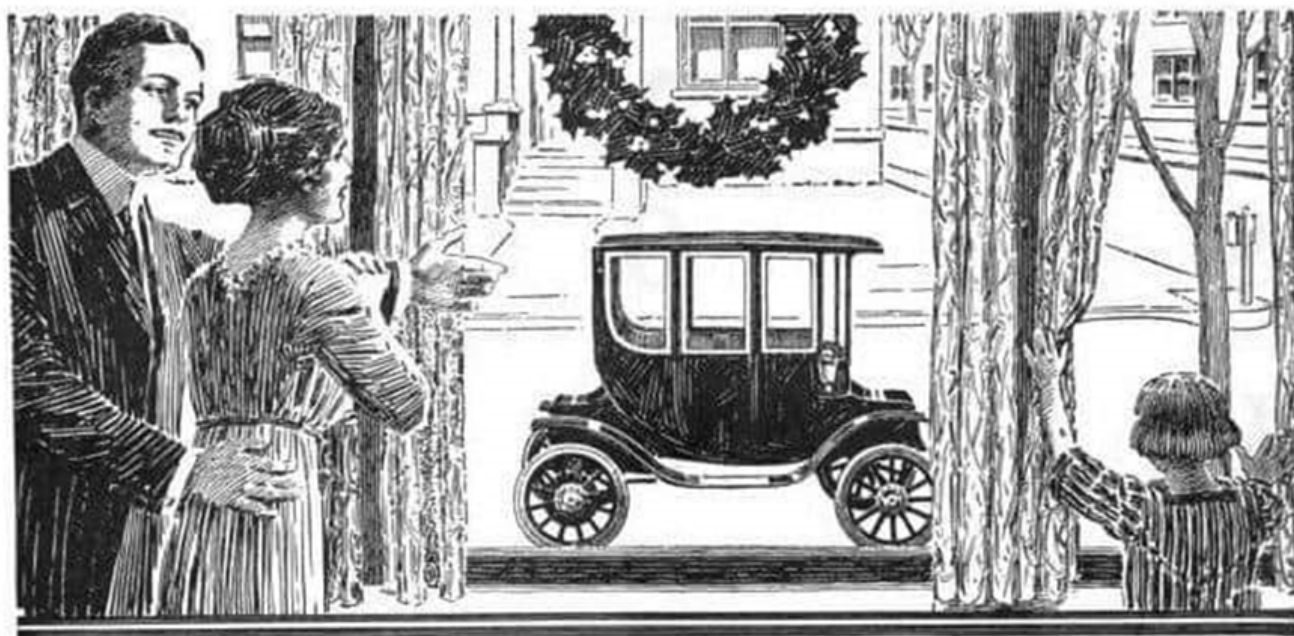

EASY RECIPE

CHEESE AND ONION MUFFINS (DIABETIC)

1 ½ Cups of Whole-meal flour
1 Dessert spoon baking powder
1 Dessert spoon sugar or substitute
1 Cup mashed pumpkin or (1/4 cup of oil)
1 Cup light Cheddar cheese, grated
1 Pkt onion soup mix
1 Cup of milk
1 Egg.



METHOD:-

Stir together the dry ingredients and then stir in the grated cheese.

Combine the milk and Onion soup mix. Let it stand for 5 minutes.

Beat the egg and add to the dry ingredients, just mixing lightly to combine them.

Spoon into a greased muffin tin and bake in a preheated oven at 180 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes.

Serve hot. Great with soup as well.
